**Program:** Our speaker this month is Andrew Cameron PHD speaking on “**The genes that make an orchid flower or the dirty little secrets that Mendel never told you**”. We will explore how a basic set of genes tells flowers their fate and how this knowledge is elaborated in the exotic flowers of orchids. Horticulturists breed plants to make new and interesting hybrids all the time. This is a practice as old as the domestication of plants. Indeed plant breeding was used to illustrate the principles of genetics by Gregor Mendel. Orchidists came to this practice as soon as exotic plants came to the greenhouses of Europe. In the last 30 years plant scientists have learned how genes influence flower formation. The story became even more interesting as the studies moved into new groups of plants such as orchids.

Andrew Cameron is a semi-retired member of the research faculty at the California Institute of Technology. He studies how the genomes of marine creatures like sea urchins and sea stars dictate the form of these animals. He is past president of the San Gabriel Valley Branch of the Cymbidium Society of America, current Vice President of CSA International, an Accredited CSA Judge, the new editor of the “CSA Cymbidium Journal” and a member of our club. He writes the Duffer’s Corner column for the *CSA Journal*. He also tries to convince cymbidiums and other cool-growing orchids that Elkhorn, CA is a good place to live! One of his major goals is to introduce orchid hobbyists to the wonderful body of biological information that underlies their pursuits.

Each member must donate one plant to the raffle for each table requested each day. **All members reserving a table must enter plants (2 minimum) in the show. If two sales tables are requested, the member must put in a display.** There will be a table for members who wish to sell 5 or fewer plants. Since this is a two-day sale, sellers are asked to volunteer at least 1 hour each day.

**44<sup>th</sup> Annual Cymbidium Congress:** In conjunction with the Santa Barbara Orchid Show “**Orchid Mystique**” being held March 15<sup>th</sup> through March 17<sup>th</sup>, the CSA Congress will be held on March 16<sup>th</sup>, starting with the CSA Annual meeting at 8:30 AM followed by lectures, a luncheon, a panel discussion and the awards dinner banquet. **2019 Auction Wrap-Up:** We had an incredible auction this year! Congratulations to everyone for one of the most successful auctions in the history of our club. During the event, 128 lots were sold in about 2 hours. We had 29 bidders which is a significant increase from the 16 bidders in 2018. The bids produced a total gross of over **\$5850** and a final net to the club treasury of over **\$3,650**. Bidding, overseen by Jeff "keep your paddle up" Trimble and Weegie "what you see is what you get" Caughlan, was fast and furious for each orchid. This was especially true for the top 3 orchids sold:

For judging, plants need to be submitted to the clerks between 6:15PM and 7:00PM in SF or Oakland and between 9:00AM and 9:30AM at Filoli. ### Carol Butcher

#### *The Road to Red Cymbidiums*



Carol Butcher is a lifelong native of upstate New York, where she became an orchid hobbyist after moving to the Rochester area. She has served as both Show Chair and Program Chair for the Genesee Region Orchid Society, which meets in Rochester, New York. Carol is an accredited American Orchid Society Judge with the Toronto Judging Center. Her orchid collection consists of about 150 plants in a mix of both species and hybrids, grown on windowsills and under lights in the home she shares with her husband and their two retired racing greyhounds.

### Dr. Ken Cameron

#### *Systematics of Cymbidiums*

Ken Cameron serves as Chair of the University of Wisconsin at Madison's Department of Botany and as Director of the Wisconsin State Herbarium, a collection of over 1.4 million specimens. His primary laboratory research interests focus on the systematics, evolution, structure and conservation of orchids. He was the first biologist to use DNA sequence data to reconstruct the evolutionary history of the orchid family and is considered the world authority on the systematics of *Vanilla*. In 2014, he was recognized by the American Society of Plant Taxonomists with the Peter Raven Award for Exceptional Botanical Outreach.

### Wenqing Perner

#### *Cypripedium in China and Their Cultivation*



Wenqing Perner is owner and co-founder of Hengduan Mountains Biotechnology Ltd. located in Sichuan, China. Since 2001, the company has focused on laboratory propagation of slipper orchids and many other orchid genera, in addition to food crops such as blueberries. Fluent in four languages, Wenqing is an internationally recognized speaker on orchids. She leads botanical tours in search of rare orchid and plant flora in western China.

### Dr. Randall Robinson

#### *What is a Cymbidium Worth?*

Randall Robinson is Deputy Director of the Institute of Sustainable Industries and Liveable Cities at Victoria University in Melbourne, Australia. He has a long history of interest in orchids, cymbidiums in particular. He participated in the Professional Gardener Training Program at Longwood Gardens and received the Eric Young Orchid Scholarship at the Royal Horticultural Society in England. He will speak on the worth of cymbidiums to members of the CSA and to the health and well-being of the wider community.



### Dave Sorokowsky

#### *Paphiopedilum rothschildianum*



Dave Sorokowsky holds a degree in biochemistry from the University of Toronto and a degree in enology and viticulture from Brock University in St. Catharines, Ontario. Winemaking and a passion for orchids prompted Dave to seek a warmer climate in California. He is an accredited American Orchid Society judge and has been hybridizing paphiopedilums for the past 10 years. His paphiopedilums have received over 75 awards to date from the AOS and the CSA, and many of those awarded plants have played important roles in his breeding program.
